Note From The TG Wire

There has been some discussion recently, both at some matches and on the SASS Wire about the age-based shooting categories. To shoot as a 49'er, Senior or Elder Statesman, must the shooter have actually HAD their 49th, 60th or 70th BIRTHDAY, or is it allow-

able to shoot in the more "senior" category starting the first day of the MONTH in which their birthday occurs? Some folks even believe that it's okay to sign up in the "older" category the first day of the YEAR they WILL turn 49, 60 or 70. The answer, on the T/G Wire per Coyote Calhoun of the Wild Bunch, is that SASS has always made it policy that the shooter MUST HAVE

PASSED the milestone birth-DAY to shoot the specified category. Example: If the person is 48 on the first day of a two day shoot, and will turn 49 on the second day of the shoot, he/she CANNOT register as a 49'er but must shoot the match as Traditional, etc. Hope this clears up some questions and gets us all on the same page of music.
