Rollin on the River-Further Adventures of Kincaids Irregulars

"Do you want to enjoy this sport, competition, comaradery of stage dressing even more? Then visit other clubs! Each club has its own flavor and flair as to the game played....different costumes, different guns, different stages. For example, we at ISR, M&M, K Kowboys all pre-select a posse and assign shooters to each. Some clubs say "we have 45 shooters today - so three posses of 15 each. Posse l starts on Stage 1, Posse 2 starts on Stage 3 and Posse 3 starts on five. "This way, people sorta' choose who they shoot with.

As a guest, you jump into a

posse of cowboys and gals, making new friends, and seeing how they run their posse. As a visitor, make extra effort to do all the posse jobs, reflecting well on yourself and your home club. We southern clubs should congratulate ourselves, our leaders, and T.G.'s for teaching us excellent safety habits, at both the loading and unloading areas and in stage design.

'Stage design' brings to mind – as you visit other clubs, bring back stage ideas. I modified my laundry stage design after visiting Guns of the Timberland. Sometimes, you take only one part of their stage – say you liked the way the pistol work was laid out, but the rifle and shotgun part was just ho-hum. So,

use their pistol idea with your own rifle and shotgun design.

When the shoot is all over, it's a good idea to help pick up and join in the goodnatured ribbing and conversation that always goes on while waiting for the scores. On the subject of scores; some clubs give ribbons, some paper certificates, some first through third, and some first, through however many shooters. I've noticed that not all clubs read the score or time, just your place first, second, third, etc. After all the prizes are passed out, the club president reads the top ten scores (times.) thinking about?
